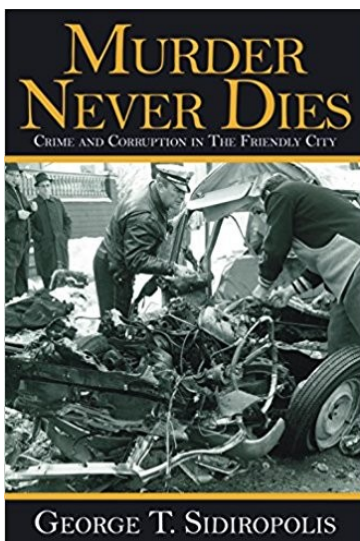

He was appointed commissioner of the division of motor vehicles for the state of West Virginia by Governor Gaston Caperton. Over the course of his career as a civil servant he worked closely with five governors. Specifically, he served as assistant to the secretary for the department of transportation. , Senior Aide to the Governor, Member of the State Parole Board and Chairman of the State Racing Commission. He is a graduate of West Liberty University. He and his wife Donna are the parents of two children, George Nico and Dave Alexander and the guardian of their nephew Mark Thomas Sidiropolis



George Sidiropolis will discuss his book, "Murder Never Dies" about the decades of rampant virgin crime and corruption in a city that became known as "Little Chicago."
